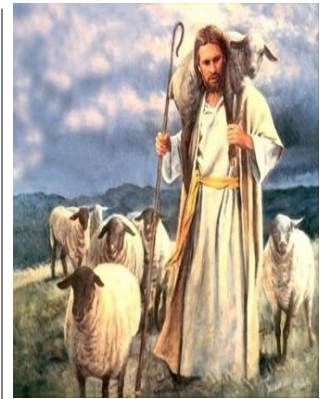
RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

DEACON'S REFLECTIONS

Sometimes, the faith that's so strong on Sundays gets forgotten during the week. Maybe not forgotten exactly, but slow to surface. Writing a comment on social media, my words were less than stellar; not unkind but not very positive. Staring at the POST button, I paused, rethought what I was about to do and deleted it.

Will you... respect the dignity of every human being?

A teacher works full time, then stops at a food pantry on the way home for a bag of groceries. A family is evicted because they couldn't pay the rent because dad's full time job only paid \$10 an hour and mom's boss cut her hours.

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people...?

At a community meal downtown, one guest starts yelling at another guest. Then he gets in line and complains about the food. The volunteers, though cautious, serve him with patience and respect.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor...?

These stories from the news, and my experience, are paired with questions from our baptismal covenant. We, I and the church respond to our neighbours, as Jesus responded to his, striving to do it with respect, justice and love. Doing so makes us Jesus' followers and enables our communities to thrive. As your deacon, I'm charged with bringing these needs of the world to the church and inviting our response. That faith we feel so strongly on Sundays can be present each day through our actions for others, answering Jesus' call, "I will, with God's help."

RECIPE CORNER

Pizzadilla

Ingredients

2 large flour tortillas
1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
1 package ready to eat pepperoni slices
1/2 cup marinara sauce



Directions

Preheat oven to 375.

Begin by heating one of your flour tortillas in a large frying pan on medium high heat. Heat both sides of your tortilla. Pour half of the marinara sauce onto the middle of the tortilla and spread with a spoon. Sprinkle half of the shredded cheese. Cover with your second tortilla and flip. Heat both sides of the tortilla, 1 minute each side. Transfer to a pizza pan. Pour marinara sauce on top of quesadilla and spread with spoon. Sprinkle remaining cheese and top with pepperoni. Bake for about 7 minutes, until cheese is fully melted.

Vegetable Corn Chowder

Ingredients

1 onion
8-10 small red potatoes (about 2 lbs. or 4-5 cups diced)
3-4 cloves garlic
3 cups corn (frozen or fresh)
3 1/2 cups vegetable broth
2 cups plain almond milk, unsweetened
2/3 cup nutritional yeast
1 1/2 tsp. smoked paprika
Salt/pepper to taste

Directions

Dice onion. In a large stockpot over medium-high heat, saute onion in 3 Tbsp. broth/water for about 7-8 minutes.

Meanwhile, mince garlic and cut potatoes into about 3/4" chunks.

Add potatoes and smoked paprika to pot. Cook 3-4 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Add minced garlic and cook for 1 minute.

Add broth, milk, corn, and nutritional yeast. Increase heat and bring to a light boil.

Cover, reduce heat, and simmer for 15-20 minutes or until potatoes are tender.

Salt/pepper to taste, and add more nutritional yeast if desired.

Leave as is, or blend some for a creamier texture.
